The Club would like to thank Kevin Lawson for his valuable contribution as assistant Secretary. David Jones has kindly taken on the new position as Chief Communications Officer and now receives and distributes all correspondence from Bowls Victoria and the Flinders Bowls Division.

Oscar Bocskay has been working tirelessly to develop our new website. Oscar is very optimistic that the new website will be published mid-December. Once complete, members will be notified of the new website address. Many thanks Oscar, a great job.

The Bar Roster is operating well with the volunteers stocking the fridge, removing empties and locking the Club rooms at night. As two of our rostered lock-up and bar staff have moved on so we need at least another 2 people to replace them to spread the work load. The Responsible Service of Alcohol (R.S.A.) course takes about 2 hours and is paid for by the club. Barney and Maurie will give you run down on the tasks and the time required, which is very minimal. Bar rostered staff do have homes to go to, be ready to leave when asked. Don't over refresh, we like to see you get home safely and come back again.

The Shire has approved an extension to our lease to 2027 subject to no objections being lodged within 30 days. The approval will allow the Board to consider future upgrades based on cash flow projections & feasibility.

The club has lodged a submission with the Shire for a grant within the 2016/17 Annual Budget. Our proposal is for the supply and installation of a second 40,000 litre bore water tank within the Club grounds to minimize the use of drinking water resources and reduce recurrent costs.

Bob Neal and Ian Williams are keen to recruit members to give an occasional hour to assist with general maintenance issues.

Members will notice new "non-smoking" signs are erected which only permits smoking in certain areas. We ask that all abide by this message and ask that you assist to make it clear to any guests.



The club is very conscious of keeping members informed "on what's happening" and maintain its name as "The Friendly Club" with good team spirit.

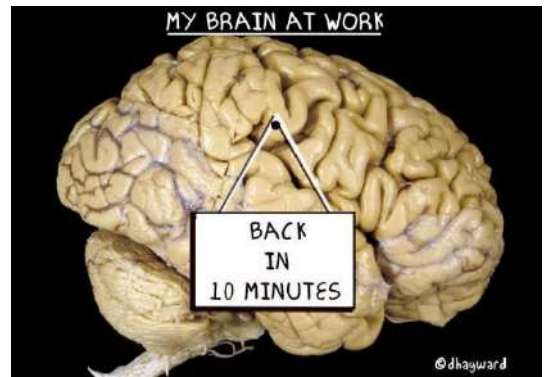
The Friday night snacks and raffle are a great social success, it is your chance to win the Members Draw but you must be present.
