
"Editor's Notes"

Greens and Surrounds

We have been able to keep John Collery fully employed throughout the restriction periods (with the assistance of Jobkeeper allowances and a Permitted Worker Permit) and the greens and surrounds are in great condition. We eagerly await to be back on the greens as soon as possible.

The Board has commenced an investigation into the potential of installing a synthetic green at the Club. We have received a quotation from Berry Bowling Systems and have appointed Equipment Solutions Plus to source available grants in order to fund at least 50% of the overall installation cost. A feasibility study is being concurrently prepared, and members will be informed as more details develop.

Business Plan

The Business Plan, which was prepared in 2018, is being reviewed and updated to focus on the Club's strategic direction for the next 3 years.

The objective of the Business Plan is to document the objectives and measure the success of the strategic direction.

Bowls Victoria and Mornington Peninsula Bowls Region News

MPB, despite being impacted by current restrictions, have developed some possible scenarios for the coming season in terms of Pre-Pennant events, Pennant calendar, Pennant format and State events.

The possible scenarios for Pennant are:

Scenario 1 - Saturday Pennant start on 31 October 2020 and Midweek Pennant start on 4 November 2020 as currently scheduled.

Scenario 2 - Saturday Pennant start on or close to 5 December 2020 and Midweek Pennant start on or close to 8 Dec 2020 and complete 14 rounds.

Scenario 3 - Saturday Pennant start on 9 Jan 2021 and Midweek Pennant start on 12 Jan 2021 and complete 14 rounds with the finals in early May.

Scenario 4 - if we get a severely interrupted season, that a seven (7) round competition plus finals be played.

Although all scenarios may be very premature depending on what future Government restrictions will comprise, the emphasis on clubs and bowlers will be flexibility in how and when we play our games.

Bowls Victoria have cancelled the 2020 Victorian Open.


Survey
