LIVING / PLAYING BOWLS WITH COVID 19 PROTOCOLS TO BE OBSERVED


Many of our members are in the most "AT RISK" section of our community and it is incumbent upon the Club to ensure the ongoing health and safety of all our members and guests. No matter the restrictions placed upon the Club by Governments and Shire, the following protocols will specifically apply to all games of bowls and practice conducted at the Club.

1. Until otherwise notified, the Clubrooms shall remain closed to all members and visitors. Toilets will be open.
2. The Match Committee is responsible for ensuring an adequate supply of sterilised mats and Jacks plus hand sanitiser is available for each day.
3. Those "rolling up" or practising must abide by these protocols.
4. Players must book in advance, the intended date and time they wish to "roll up" or practise at the Club, on the sheet provided on the match notice board (behind the glass).
5. Players must register their presence at the Club (name, time played & telephone number) on the sheet provided on the match notice board (behind the glass).
6. All players MUST sanitise their hands prior to, and on completion of play.
7. Mats and Jacks are to be handled by one player only. (This may mean 1 x Jack at each end).
8. Rye Bowls Club recommends that masks be worn at all times.
9. Social distancing (i.e. 1.5 metres apart) is to be maintained at all times.
10. Bowls rakes are not to be used at any time.

In addition to the above protocols for play/practise, the following shall apply:

- The Clubroom including Bar and Kitchen will be closed except for toilet facilities. Remember - our Liquor License does not permit alcohol to be brought onto the Club premises or grounds.
- When using the toilets please make sure you have cleaned and wiped all the surfaces that you have been in contact with. Wash your hands before leaving the facility. Use the sanitiser products provided.
- Remember, all the above is to protect your health and the health of fellow members.
